Dear Ms. Bruecks:

This responds to your September 9, 2005 letter asking if a DOT-3HT specification cylinder may be used for "paintball" service and then be hydrostatically retested in accordance with §180.209 of the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR; 49 CFR Parts 171-180).

The HMR provides that a DOT-3HT specification cylinder is authorized for aircraft use only and only for nonflammable gases. The HMR also prescribes the requalification requirements for DOT-3HT cylinders. In accordance with §180.209(k), in addition to the other requirements of this section, a cylinder marked DOT-3HT must be requalified in accordance with CGA C-8 pamphlet.

For reasons of safety, it is at the discretion of an authorized retester whether it will accept a cylinder for requalification and perform a hydrostatic retest on the cylinder. We do not recommend retest of such cylinders that are used in unauthorized cylinder service, and suggests that you inform your customers.



Subject: Request for a letter of interpretation

Can you please help my company with a written letter of clarification on the following issue?

## CFR 49 § 180.209 Requirements for requalification of specification cylinders

(k) 3HT cylinders. In addition to the other requirements of this section, a cylinder marked DOT-3HT must be requalified in accordance with CGA C-8 (IBR, see §171.7 of this subchapter)

#### CGA C-8 states:

- 1.3 Cylinders made in accordance with 3HT specifications are similar to those made under 3AA specifications in function and methods of fabrication. The major difference is that 3HT specification cylinders are containers only for inside aircraft use; are made to a higher allowable design stress; and, therefore, have a thinner wall thickness and a lower weight.
- 2. Filled 3HT series cylinders shall be shipped in suitable outside containers such as corrugated cartons or wooden boxes, which are considered sufficient to protect the cylinders from the adverse affects of rough handling during shipment. It is strongly recommended that empty 3HT series cylinders also be stored and transported in the same type of outside container to prevent damage to the cylinder.

We have had numerous 3HT cylinders designed for paintball service come in for hydro test. It is my interpretation that 3HT specification cylinders are not suitable and thus may not be used for paintball service. Cylinders in paintball service definitely do not receive the delicate treatment mentioned in CGA C-8 section 2.

Can 3HT paintball cylinders be tested, filled and used in such a manner? Is the paintball service a suitable application for 3HT specification cylinders?

The manufacture of the cylinders I refer to is M9001, Gas Cylinder Technology Inc., P.O. Box 3188, STN Main, Tecumseh, Ontario N6N 2M4 Canada.

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
